Term 1:

By October 15, students will be issued a Progress Report with comments on their learning progress, behavior and on subject-specific competencies. At the end of Term 1, students will write an exam exploring a current issue around *Migration* assess the credibility of different news sources on this topic, and take a stance on how this issue ought to be tackled. This will count for 20% of their mark for Term 1. By November 20, students will be issued a Report Card.

Term 2:

Students will write a midyear exam that explores a current issue around *The Environment* and *Wealth Disparities*, assess the credibility of different news sources on this topic, and take a stance on how this issue ought to be tackled. This will count for 20% of their mark for Term 2. By March 15, students will be issued a Report Card.

Term 3:

At the end of Term 3, students will write a final exam that explores a current issue around *Global Tensions and Conflict* and create a news source on this topic which takes a stance on how this issue ought to be tackled. This will count for 20% of their overall <u>mark</u>. By June 28, students will be issued a Report Card with their final <u>class marks</u>. Final grades and transcripts will be available through the MEQ Portal at the beginning of July.
